AWARD CATEGORIES

Major Project of the Year

SPONSORED BY

ENTER FOR THIS AWARD IF: Your company has recently completed, or is currently undertaking, an innovative and challenging overseas project with a contract value **over £10 million** (individually or in consortium). It may be physical or organisational, and may involve consultancy or construction.

Consultancy Project of the Year

SPONSORED BY

ENTER FOR THIS AWARD IF: Your company has recently completed, or is currently undertaking an overseas project with a contract value of less than **£10 million**. The project should be successful, innovative and challenging to achieve. The project may be physical or organisational.

Development Project of the Year

ENTER FOR THIS AWARD IF: Your company has recently completed, or is currently undertaking an overseas development project funded either by bilateral or multilateral aid. The project may be physical or organisational and should be successful, innovative and challenging to achieve. The judges may decide to separate this award into two categories by fee value.

Environmental Impact Award of the Year

SPONSORED BY

ENTER FOR THIS AWARD IF: You individually, or your company, can demonstrate input into positive environmental change, freestanding or as part of a larger initiative. Designed to recognise projects delivered overseas, **or in the UK with international significance**, this award is especially suited, but not limited to, the area of intelligent and green building, and green building and urban regeneration.

Innovation Award of the Year

SPONSORED BY

ENTER FOR THIS AWARD IF: Your company or you as an individual have demonstrated outstanding physical or intellectual innovation which has either taken place overseas, **or in the UK with international significance**. This innovation may be freestanding or as part of a project. You may or may not have received financial benefit from the innovation.

Sports Leisure Tourism Project of the Year

SPONSORED BY

ENTER FOR THIS AWARD IF: You have recently completed, or are currently undertaking an overseas project of any value which is relevant to this category. The project may be physical or organisational and may or may not involve construction.

Young Consultant of the Year

ENTER FOR THIS AWARD IF: You have worked on an overseas initiative within the last twelve months which may or may not have generated income for you or your company. Judges will be looking for depth of understanding of the overseas initiative and the personal endeavour which you have made, as well as your awareness and interpretation of local community needs.

To enter you must be less than 30 years of age on 1 October 2010.

2010/11 BRITISH EXPERTISE INTERNATIONAL AWARDS

Your Submission

Winning entries will be those that are innovative and challenging. Projects may be physical or organisational and may involve consultancy work or construction. With the exception of the Environmental Impact and Innovation Awards, entries should relate to overseas projects.

Entries should state clearly:

- How the design specification was interpreted
- The particular challenges faced in implementation
- The ways in which these challenges were met

Corporate Awards:

The judges will look carefully at the interpretation of the project specification and will expect value for money, timely delivery and client satisfaction.

Young Consultant Award:

The judges will look for an individual who has demonstrated outstanding imagination, innovation and energy in a particular programme or series of initiatives.

Judging will take place in early October.

Winners will be announced at the **Awards Dinner on Thursday, 11 November 2010** at the **Institute of Directors, Pall Mall, London SW1Y 5ED**.

Winners will be presented with a personalised trophy.

ALL short-listed entries will receive a Certificate of Commendation from HRH The Duke of Gloucester at a VIP reception prior to the Awards Dinner. ALL short-listed entries will be featured on the British Expertise website and in the Finalists booklet available on the evening. Further copies of the booklet will be available on request.

The judges will not hold candidate interviews in any category - so entries should demonstrate clearly the reasons why an award is deserved.

You may enter any number of categories with projects which have either been completed within the last 2 years, or have reached the end of a distinct phase.

Entries are invited from any team or individual responsible for the project.

Entries may only be submitted by members of British Expertise.

To Enter

The British Expertise International Awards are **FREE** to enter but you must be a member. Each submission should be accompanied by a separate entry form. Photocopies are acceptable.

Each entry should be submitted on a CD and should include the following documents:

- Completed application form (we can email this to you or you can include a hard copy)
- 100 word summary (MS Word format preferred)*
- Submission presentation (750-2500 words) – to be printed for judging (pdf or MS Word format)
- A maximum of 6 separate images (jpg, 300 dpi)
- Your company logo (jpg, 300 dpi)
